 receive produce fresh from the farm while
 supporting the local farmers in their community.



A World PEAS share is...



Good for you and the environment. Our produce is grown locally in Eastern Massachusetts and harvested fresh, within hours of pick-up. World PEAS farmers use organic and sustainable growing practices. We source additional fruits and

vegetables from local farms using certified organic practices and farms that use integrated pest management.



Convenient. Along with your vegetables and fruit each week, your membership in the World PEAS CSA includes a newsletter with storage advice and recipes for that week's vegetables. You can pick up your share at one of several locations in the greater Lowell and

Boston areas. If you are interested in having shares delivered to your town, inquire about coordinating a distribution site.



Community focused. The World PEAS is a network of small-scale and beginning farmers from North America, Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe and the Caribbean who manage small farms near Lowell as part of the New Entry Sustainable Farming Project. Many

of these farmers are economically and socially disadvantaged. By buying a farm share with the World PEAS CSA, you will get fresh, local, healthful produce, while supporting the next generation of multi-cultural farmers.

Share options

A World PEAS CSA share combines a selection of more than **70 locally-grown traditional and ethnic vegetables with seasonal berries, melons, tree fruit and more.** Our farm share is as diverse as the farmers who produce it.

Large Shares include enough vegetables and fruit each week to feed a family of four or five. 18 Distributions (\$39 each), June to October....**\$695**

A limited number of **Small Shares** include enough vegetables and fruit each week to feed two adults. 18 Distributions (\$25 each), June to October.....**\$450**

A separate **Extended Season Share** offers cold-hardy vegetables and storage crops into late autumn/early winter. 3 Distributions (\$40 each), October to December**\$120**

Large and small share prices include a \$50 membership fee that helps support new farmer training and production assistance, while covering CSA operational costs including newsletter publications, share-packing, delivery, and administration. Members receive invitations to New Entry field trainings, farm tours, and special events, as well as access to the pick-your-own garden in Dracut, MA.
