the farmers who produce  
it. CSA members receive  
produce fresh from the farm while  
supporting the local farmers in their community.



## A World PEAS share is...



**Good for you and the environment.** Our produce is grown locally and harvested fresh, within hours of pick-up. World PEAS farmers use organic and sustainable growing practices. We source additional fruits and vegetables from farms within

100 miles of Boston that use certified organic practices as well as farms that use integrated pest management.



**Convenient.** Along with your vegetables and fruit each week, your membership in the World PEAS CSA includes a newsletter with crop storage advice and recipes for that week's vegetables. You can pick up your share at one of several locations in the greater Lowell and

Boston areas. If you are interested in having shares delivered to your town, inquire about coordinating a distribution site.



**Socially Just.** The World PEAS Cooperative is a network of small-scale and beginning farmers from North America, Africa, Asia and the Caribbean who manage farms near Lowell as part of the New Entry Sustainable Farming Project. Many of these farmers are

economically and socially disadvantaged. By buying a farm share with the World PEAS CSA, you will get fresh, local, healthful produce, while directly supporting the next generation of multi-cultural farmers.

## Share options

A World PEAS CSA share combines a selection of more than **70 locally-grown traditional and ethnic vegetables with seasonal berries, melons, tree fruit and more.** Our farm share is as diverse as the farmers who produce it.

**Large Shares** include enough vegetables and fruit each week to feed a family of four or five. 18 Distributions, June to October.....**\$705**

**Small Shares** include enough vegetables and fruit each week to feed two adults. 18 Distributions, June to October.....**\$465**

A separate **Extended Season Share** offers cold-hardy vegetables and storage crops through Thanksgiving. 3 Distributions, October to November.....**\$125**

When you join the World PEAS CSA, in addition to getting fresh, healthy produce, you are investing in the New Entry Sustainable Farming Project's training, support, and technical assistance for beginning, immigrant, and refugee farmers. As partners in our work to strengthen the local food system, you are welcome to attend New Entry field trainings, farm tours, and events.
